First Sunday of Advent, Year A Matthew 24:37-44

Many of us feel the pressure early in the holiday season to be ready for Christmas. But today's Gospel challenges us to be ready for something other than the gift-giving of Christmas.

TALK TOGETHER

As a family, talk about what it means to be ready for the day of the Lord. One of the roles of the family, the domestic church, is to be a school of faith leading one another to salvation. Reflect together as a family on how your family helps one another to be better Christians. Commit to one thing that your family will do this Advent season to help one another be better Christians. You might choose to write this commitment down and post it in a prominent place in your home, perhaps near your family's Advent wreath.

Read today's Gospel, Matthew 24:37-44.

Pray together that God will help you in this Advent commitment. Pray together the Lord's Prayer or today's Psalm 122: 1-2, 3-4, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9.

Lean juntos el Evangelio de Mateo 24:37-44.

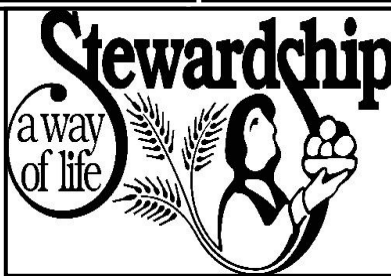
OREN JUNTOS

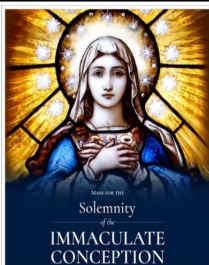

Advent Wreath/Candles Blessing

The use of the Advent Wreath is a traditional practice which has found its place in the Church as well as in the home. The blessing of an Advent Wreath takes place on the First Sunday of Advent or on the evening before the First Sunday of Advent.

All make the sign of the cross as the leader says:

Our help is in the name of the Lord.

Response: *Who made heaven and earth.*

With hands joined, the leader says:

Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, and he is the Savior of every nation. Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May he come quickly and not delay.

A season of **hope**, preparation, EXPECTATION & celebration



The ADVENT WREATH is a popular symbol used as the focus of prayer throughout the season

Advent is made up of four weeks, divided into two periods:

1 First Sunday of Advent until December 16

focus: Christ's second coming at the end of time

2 December 17 to 24

focus: Preparation for celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ

The first Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year



"Advent" (Latin) MEANS "a coming or arrival"

Through prayer, spiritual reading, acts of charity, and participation in Eucharist, Advent helps us to expand the meaning of our lives, so that we are not ends in ourselves, but a people who seek Christ as our hopeful end and joyful fulfillment



Advent is more than the preparation for Christ's birth. It also celebrates the three-fold coming of the Lord:

- Remembering the events that surrounded the Lord's coming long ago
- Celebrating his coming among us today
- Looking forward to his final coming in glory



Our prayer at Advent is one of hope and love:

Come, Lord Jesus!

St. Nicholas Day Traditions

December 6th is the feast day of Saint Nicholas, the patron saint of children. This feast day is one for children to be excited about as they count down the days on their Advent calendars in anticipation of Christmas day.

St. Nicholas, a 4th century Bishop of Myra, is mainly celebrated in many European and Eastern countries. These celebrations eventually spread to America and elsewhere as Catholicism spread throughout the world. One of the old traditions surrounding his feast day is for kids to leave their shoes and/or socks out overnight in front of the fireplace or near the window so that St. Nicholas can fill them with special fruits, nuts, candies, and other small gifts and treats.

This tradition grew from the story of when St. Nicholas actually threw bags of dowry money, through a window, into the home of an impoverished family to rescue their daughters from being sold into slavery. This was just one of his many acts of good will and charity towards the poor, especially poor children.

Today parents can bring the traditions of St. Nicholas Day to their families by placing bags of chocolate candy coins, small toys, fruit and nuts, small religious items, or even a Christmas ornament into their stocking, shoes or in their advent calendar (if it has spaces to put things).

Candy canes also originated with St. Nicholas Day as they symbolize a shepherd's staff. Children can leave traditional gifts for St. Nicholas as well...carrots and hay for his donkey. Yes . . . St. Nicholas was known to ride a donkey loaded with gifts for children before the story gravitated to flying reindeer!
